DESCRIPTION

Table or floor lamp with diffused light. Matt injection moulded batch-dyed ABS diffuser consisting of 6 assembled modules. Upper diffuser in opaline polycarbonate, white epoxy powder coated metal base. The cable is fitted with the dimmer, for the gradual adjustment of brightness.

technical details

Nature is one of the sources of inspiration for Behive, a table lamp which, as the name suggests, recalls the shape of a beehive. Its rounded, sensual and at the same time stylish shape was created by an overlapping sequence of rings, each of a larger diameter starting at the small base, from which the lamp appears to take off. Owing to the particular shape and tilt of the rings, the light source is not directly visible from any perspective, thereby enhancing the appeal of the lamp. Its soft and inimitable lighting effect makes it an object, a decorative ornament, a pure emotion. Charming and magical when it is on, Behive turns into a poetic, domestic sculpture when it is turned off, revealing its dual, reversible nature: white turns black, light becomes shadow. This product arouses a unique emotion and is perfect to highlight an important as well as an intimate setting, in different uses: on top of a side board, a table or even on the floor.
